# Class One - Mrs Joyce & Mr Taylor



This week we have enjoyed reading the book Rosie's walk. The children have enjoyed retelling the story, then making up and writing down their own. They have enjoyed painting farm pictures and labeling the different animals. In number they have enjoyed sorting different items focusing on colour, size, shape and other various factors.

We have also been exploring the outside, seeing if we can spot the different signs of Spring. This then resulted in some beautiful paintings and rubbings from the children within class.

Just a reminder that it is extremely important to read with your child at least 3 times a week. We have noticed a decline in children reading at home.

Reading impacts massively on all areas of learning, as reading is an essential skill needed to access the whole curriculum in later school life. If children fall significantly behind in their reading in the early years, it can be difficult for them to catch up.











#### Class 2 - Miss Kent



This week, class 2 have been on a journey with our curious new wordless book. The children have made some fantastic inferences and predictions. They have made connections to prior knowledge and had some wonderful ideas about the different places featured.

In Maths, both year groups have been exploring fractions and have been focusing on halves. Year 2 have been finding quarters and next week they will recognise three quarters and thirds.

In Art, we have been drawing stick men using L S Lowry as our artist inspiration. We used whiteboards and worked in partners to pose and complete a quick 2 minute sketch, looking at form and used our pens to line up and gain perspective on shape.

In History, children listened to various sound clips to try to work out what topic we will be covering this term. We also compared old and new methods of transport and talked about similarities and differences.

We have talked about our faith trail visit to help us make connections whilst learning about Hinduism this term. The children were quite excited about our new learning journey and did a great job of talking about what they recognised in our picture enquiry.

\*\*\* This week we have had our first Art club session and what a wonderful job the children have made of creating their own worry dolls. Each one was unique and carefully thought out by our very creative art clubbers. Well done!\*\*\*















Class 3 - Miss Fallows & Mr Taylor



This week we have finally completed our learning around our school text, "The Boy Who Grew Dragons."

The children worked in pairs to discuss the feelings between Grandad and Tomas after all of the events in the story unfolded and Grandad found out the truth. They all did a brilliant job of suggesting ideas of how Grandad would feel as well as reasons why Tomas might not have felt he could be truthful with his Grandad.

The children finished the week by planning and writing a letter of apology from Tomas to his Grandad.

I have been so impressed by the children's enthusiasm over the course of this topic and the work that they have produced, a big well done to them all!!

In Maths we have looked at multiplying a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number using a formal written method. This has been a really tricky area for the children and has taken lots of hard work, particularly when setting the multiplications out correctly.

We will be continuing to work on this again in next weeks lessons.

During morning spellings, we have looked at the /g/ sound spelt /gue/. We looked at the definitions and etymology of words such as monologue, dialogue and analogue, as well as practising the words in our daily sentence dictations.

Please can I ask that you encourage your child to practise their home spellings frequently, ready for their spelling tests on a Wednesday as some children are having to repeat the same spellings numerous times.


